I was an Army private... a Naval commander... an Air Force bombardier. no man knows me... no name marks my tomb, for I am every Australian and New Zealand serviceman... I am the Unknown Soldier.

I am all of them. And I am one of you.

I died for a cause I held just in the service of my land... that you and yours may say in freedom... I am proud to be an ANZAC.
